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- 4. NATIONAL POWER CORPORATION'S RESPONSES FOR THE FOLLOWING REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATIONS DURING PRE-BID CONFERENCE:
  - a) Is Coastguard Certificate required?

Response: Yes, the company together with the product should be accredited by the PCG as per Memorandum Circular No. 01-2005 Revised Rules on Prevention, Containment, Abatement and Control of Oil Marine Pollution issued by the PCG

b) With reference to Technical Specification the fabric material to be used is Polyester, Polyester is highly flammable and the normally used material is Poly-vinyl or PVC, Kindly confirm the material to be used

Response: The material to be used for the OSCB is Polyester or approved equal or higher in conformance with the Philippine Coastguard's (PCG) minimum requirement.

c) With reference to Section V – Special Condition of the Contract GCC Clause 1 – Delivery and Documents – For Goods supplied from abroad "present the following document as applicable with the documentary requirements of any letter of credit issued taking precedence:" our main concern is do we still need to comply with this requirement when we're not doing letter of credit?

Response: For Goods supplied from abroad, the documentary requirements listed under (i) to (viii) will still be required whether the Supplier opens a letter of credit or not. The said statement only clarified that if the Supplier opted to open a letter of credit for the Goods, the documentary requirements for such letter of credit will take precedence over the documentary requirements listed under (i) to (viii).

d) With reference to Section II – Instruction to Bidders 10.2 "The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in ITB Clause 5.3 should have been completed within Five (5) Years prior to the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids" May we request to extend it up to Seven (7) years?

Response: No. The Five (5) years relevant period of SLCC reckoned from the date of submission and receipt of bids will remain the same
