3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA 5183.

- Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from National Power Corporation, Bids and Contracts Services Division and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below during office hours (8:00AM to 5:00PM), Monday to Friday.
- A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders from the given address and website(s) and upon payment of the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB. <u>Bidding fee may be refunded in accordance with the guidelines based on the grounds provided under Section 41 of R.A. 9184 and its Revised IRR.</u>
- 6. The National Power Corporation will hold Pre-Bid Conference (see table above) and/or through video conferencing or webcasting which shall be open to prospective bidders.

Only registered bidder/s shall be allowed to participate for the conduct of virtual pre-bid conference. **Unregistered bidders** may attend the Pre-Bid Conference at the Kañao Room, NPC subject to the following:

- a. Only a maximum of two (2) representatives from each bidder / company shall be allowed to participate during the virtual pre-bid conference.
- A "No Face mask / No Entry" policy shall be implemented in the NPC premises. Face mask shall be 3-ply surgical or KN95 mask type.
- c. The requirements herein stated including the medium of submission shall be subject to GPPB Resolution No. 09-2020 dated 07 May 2020
- d. The Guidelines on the Implementation of Early Procurement Activities (EPA) shall be subject to GPPB Circular No. 06-2019 dated 17 July 2019
- 7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through (i) manual submission at the office address indicated below; (ii) online or electronic submission before the specified time stated in the table above for opening of bids. Late bids shall not be accepted.
- 8. All Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in ITB Clause 14.
- Bid opening shall be on Kañao Function Room, NPC Head Office, Diliman, Quezon City and/or via online platform to be announced by NPC. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity.

The National Power Corporation reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised IRR of R.A. 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SECTION II – INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Scope of Bid

The National Power Corporation (NPC or NAPOCOR) wishes to receive Bids for the SUPPLY OF LABOR, TOOLS, EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS, TECHNICAL EXPERTISE AND SUPERVISION FOR THE ON-LINE PCB TREATMENT OF TWO (2) 31.5MVA POWER TRANSFORMERS OF PULANGI IV HEP, with identification number PR No MG-PLM22-061.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is composed of one (1) lot and will be awarded to one (1) Bidder in one complete contract, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for CY 2022 in the amount of ₽ 19,000,000.00.
- 2.2. The source of funding is the Corporate Operating Budget of the National Power Corporation.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.



5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. Foreign ownership exceeding those allowed under the rules may participate when citizens, corporations, or associations of a country, included in the list issued by the GPPB, the laws or regulations of which grant reciprocal rights or privileges to citizens, corporations, or associations of the Philippines.

The foreign bidder claiming eligibility by reason of their country's extension of reciprocal rights to Filipinos shall submit a certification from the relevant government office of their country stating that Filipinos are allowed to participate in their government procurement activities for the same item/product. The said certification shall be validated during the post-qualification of bidders.

- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No.9184, the Bidder shall have an SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be at least equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC.
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under ITB Clause 18.

7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The portions of Project and the maximum percentage allowed to be subcontracted are indicated in the BDS, which shall not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the contracted Goods.

- 7.2. The Supplier may identify its subcontractor during the contract implementation stage. Subcontractors identified during the bidding may be changed during the implementation of this Contract. Subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under Section 23.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in ITB Clause 5 to the implementing or end-user unit.
- 7.3. Subcontracting of any portion of the Project does not relieve the Supplier of any liability or obligation under the Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants, or workmen as fully as if these were the Supplier's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants, or workmen.



8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on the specified date and time and either at its physical address and/or through videoconferencing/webcasting as indicated in paragraph 6 of the IB.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the IB, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in Section VIII (NPCSF-GOODS-01 Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in ITB Clause 5.3 should have been completed within Fifteen (15) Years prior to the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 10.4. The Statement of the bidder's Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) (NPCSF-GOODS-03) and List of all Ongoing Government & Private Contracts Including Contracts Awarded but not yet Started (NPCSF-GOODS-02) shall comply with the documentary requirements specified in the BDS.

11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in Section VIII (NPCSF-GOODS-01 - Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the IB shall not be accepted.



11.4. For Foreign-funded Procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Bid Prices

- 12.1. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
 - a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, exwarehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
 - iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
 - iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in the BDS.
 - b. For Goods offered from abroad:
 - i. Unless otherwise stated in the BDS, the price of the Goods shall be quoted delivered duty paid (DDP) with the place of destination in the Philippines as specified in the BDS. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.
 - ii. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, as listed in the BDS.

13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

14. Bid Security

- 14.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the BDS, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the BDS.
- 14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid for One Hundred Twenty (120) calendar days from the date of opening of bids. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.



15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

16.1. The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the IB.

17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the IB. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

18. Domestic Preference

18.1. The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring Entity's BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by ITB Clause 14 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.



- 19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in **Section VI** (**Technical Specifications**), although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the <u>BDS</u> for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.
- 19.4. The Project shall be awarded to one (1) Bidder in one complete contract.
- 19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder. For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post-Qualification

20.1. Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the BDS.

21. Signing of the Contract

21.1. The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the BDS.

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SECTION IV – GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC).

2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

- Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the revised 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the SCC.

3. Performance Security

- 3.1. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 3.2. The performance bond to be posted by the Contractor must also comply with additional requirements specified in the SCC.

4. Inspection and Tests

The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Project specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity in accordance with the Generic Procurement Manual. In addition to tests in the SCC, Section VI (Technical Specifications) shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires, and where they are to be

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conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

5. Warranty

- 5.1 In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 5.2 The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

6. Liability of the Supplier

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

Where the Supplier is required under Contract to deliver the Goods CIF, CIP, or DDP, transport of the Goods to the port of destination or such other named place of destination in the Philippines, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged and paid for by the Supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the Contract Price.

Where the Supplier is required under this Contract to transport the Goods to a specified place of destination within the Philippines, defined as the Project Site, transport to such place of destination in the Philippines, including insurance and storage, as shall be specified in this Contract, shall be arranged by the Supplier, and related costs shall be included in the contract price.

The Procuring Entity accepts no liability for the damage of Goods during transit other than those prescribed by INCOTERMS for DDP deliveries. In the case of Goods supplied from within the Philippines or supplied by domestic Suppliers risk and title will not be deemed to have passed to the Procuring Entity until their receipt and final acceptance at the final destination.



Intellectual Property Rights -

The Supplier shall indemnify the Procuring Entity against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the Goods or any part thereof.

Advance payment not to exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the contract amount shall be allowed and paid within sixty (60) calendar days from effectivity of the contract and upon the submission to and acceptance by the Procuring Entity of an irrevocable letter of credit or bank guarantee issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank. The irrevocable letter of credit or bank guarantee must be for an equivalent amount, shall remain valid until the goods are delivered, and accompanied by a claim for advance payment.

TS-1.0 GENERAL

This specification covers the Supply of Labor, Tools, Equipment, Materials, Technical Expertise, and Supervision for the Online PCB Treatment (Mineral Insulating Oil Regeneration and Decontamination) of Two (2) 31.5 MVA Power Transformers of NPC Pulangi IV HEPP by the Chemical Control Order (CCO) for PCB and the existing DENR-EMB Rules and Regulations on the proper handling, treatment and disposal of hazardous wastes, DAO 2013-22: Revised Procedure and Standards for the Management of Hazardous Waste (Revising DAO 2014-36) of RA 6969: Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Wastes Control Act of 1990.

The Supplier shall accept full responsibility for his work including documentation, mobilization, on-site treatment, clean-up of any spillage, warranty provisions, and compliance with the applicable laws and regulations, and the requirements of this Specification.

TS-2.0 SCOPE

The works and services to be performed under this contract is the conduct of Online PCB Treatment (Mineral Insulating Oil Regeneration and Decontamination Service) for the two (2) unit PCB contaminated 31.5 MVA power transformers, which shall essentially consist of but not limited to the following:

- a. The Contractor shall conduct a coordination meeting with NPC Pulangi IV HEPP representatives before the conduct of the Online PCB before and during the on-site mobilization.
- Securing any payment of corresponding fees for the clearances, certificates, and permits/licenses needed for the conduct of the work and services.
- c. Conduct safety briefing by the Safety/Contingency Plan with NPC Pulangi IV HEPP personnel who will directly supervise the work throughout the contract and provision of PPEs, required labels, safety materials, and alarms in case of emergency during the process.
- d. Mobilization to the Site of necessary resources, such as personnel, equipment, accessories, and other supplies (reagents and consumables) required for the project.
- e. Securing the work areas by proper grounding and provision of waterproof polyethylene sheets to prevent accidental ground contamination, before, during, and after the process.



- f. Installation of the Decontamination Equipment and accessories near the two (2) 31.5 MVA power transformers to commence the online PCB treatment/decontamination process.
- g. Conduct of Mineral Insulating Oil Regeneration and Decontamination of the Two (2) 31.5 MVA Power Transformers of NPC Pulangi IV HEPP and monitoring of the process.
- h. The Contractor shall submit to NPC Pulangi IV HEPP, the Results of the Oil Analysis before and after the online treatment for the following parameters: PCB, Moisture Content, Acidity, the Dielectric Dissipation Factor (tan delta), and Dielectric Breakdown Voltage. Analysis of PCB in oil should be conducted by a DENR-recognized Environmental Laboratory and the PCB concentration should be less than 2.0 mg/kg after the online treatment.
- Treatment shall only be considered complete and acceptable only when test results of the insulating oil indicate a PCB concentration of less than 2 mg/kg per EMB Approved Method of Analysis, MC No. 2014-007.
- j. Once PCB-free concentration is achieved, the power transformer will be de-energized again to allow the disconnection of the Decontamination equipment.
- k. Provision of appropriate Diesel Generator set to supply their decontamination unit with the required power requirement.
- I. Provision of forklift (if necessary) to handle their decontamination unit including appurtenances.
- m. Contractor shall ensure that the plant provides the six (6) hours unit shutdown to allow setting up of the decontamination unit BEFORE treatment and the six (6) hours unit shutdown that will be provided to allow dis-assembly of the decontamination unit AFTER treatment shall be strictly followed. Any request for extension shall require prior approval of NPC Pulangi IV HEPP and costs relating to the treatment schedule shall be solely borne by the Contractor.
- n. Conduct clean-up of any spillage whether PCB containing or non-PCB containing; the removal of contaminated materials in the work areas.
- o. Transport, treatment, and disposal of residual/hazardous wastes generated during the decontamination process in accordance with DAO 2013-22. Assist NPC Pulangi IV HEPP PCO in the application of Permit to Transport (PTT) and Hazardous Waste Manifest and provide a DENR-registered Transporter and Treatment, Storage and Disposal (TSD) Facility and issuance of Certificate of Treatment.
- p. Submission of a written report to NPC Pulangi IV HEPP in case of an oil spill and/or accident during the entire duration of the project implementation.

q. All other works which are not specified on the Technical Specifications that are necessary for the completion of the project shall be provided by the Contractor.

TS-3.0 DELIVERY PERIOD AND LOCATION

The delivery period shall be **NINETY (90) CALENDAR DAYS** reckoned from the contract effectivity date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

The services to be supplied shall be conducted at Pulangi IV HEP, Maramag, Bukidnon.

Mobilization of the Contractor's tools and equipment, accessories, and manpower resources required to conduct the Online PCB Treatment (Mineral Insulating Oil Regeneration and Decontamination Service) of the two (2) unit PCB contaminated 31.5 MVA power transformers from NPC Pulangi IV HEPP shall commence only upon the conduct of coordination meeting of the Contractor with NPC Pulangi HEPP representatives.

TS-4.0 ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

The Contractor shall submit to NPC Pulangi IV HEPP, the Results of the Oil Analysis before and, after the online treatment process for the following parameters: PCB, Moisture Content, Acidity, the Dielectric Dissipation Factor (tan delta), and Dielectric Breakdown Voltage. Analysis of PCB in oil should be conducted by a DENR-Recognized Environmental Laboratory and the PCB concentration should be less than 2.0 mg/kg after the online treatment.

The Contract is deemed completed upon the issuance of the Contractor of the Certificate of Regeneration and Decontamination of the two (2) 31.5 MVA power transformers and "Certificate of Treatment" for the generated residual wastes and correspondingly issuance of "Certificate of Acceptance" by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP for the billing payment.

TS-8.0 LIABILITIES

As soon as the commissioned DENR-registered transporter of the Contractor has accepted the residual/hazardous wastes for transportation from NPC Pulangi IV HEPP premises to the Contractor's commissioned DENR-registered TSD facility/site, and/or left the NPC premises, NPC Pulangi IV HEPP shall no longer be liable for claims from the Contractor or any person's/entities arising from any incident or whatsoever, whether the



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hazardous/residual waste is in the Custody of the commissioned DENR-registered transporter of the Contractor, during transport or before disposal at the Contractor's commissioned DENR-registered TSD facility, and the Contractor shall depend/protect NPC Pulangi IV in court against any claims at Contractor's expenses.

Nevertheless, NPC Pulangi IV HEPP retains ownership of the hazardous/residual waste it has generated until the said hazardous/residual wastes have been disposed of and issued with a Certificate of Treatment by the existing laws and regulations per RA 6969.

The Contractor agrees that all information, in whatever form or medium, it may obtain from NPC Pulangi IV HEPP during the term of the Contract will be treated in strict confidence and will never be disclosed to any party, and that the Contractor shall not transfer, publish, disclose or otherwise make available such information or any portion thereof to any third party without NPC Pulangi IV HEPP's prior written consent.

TS-9.0 GOVERNING LAW

The Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the provision specified under RA 9184 (Government Procurement Reform Act), its IRR and subsequent amendment issued by the Government Procurement Policy Board, and other relevant laws of the Philippines, including but not limited to RA 6969, DAO 2004-01, DAO 2013-22, EMC 2015-004, EMC 2015-007, MC 2014-007, and all applicable laws, where the facility is found and all port regulations for the port of departure, all transit ports, and port entry.

TS-10.0 FORCE MAJEURE

Acts of GOD, accidents not attributable to the fault or negligence of the Contractor, epidemic, disasters, earthquake, typhoon, bad weather or sabotage, and any other accidents, whatsoever beyond the reasonable control of Contactor, as a consequence of which the work is delayed, shall be considered force majeure.

Should any such force majeure \mathfrak{r} even occur, the Contractor shall promptly notify NPC Pulangi IV HEPP in writing and the contract period shall be reasonably extended if so warranted by the circumstances without any additional cost to NPC.

TS-11.0 LIABILITY AND LOSS AND /OR DAMAGE

The contractor shall be liable and shall indemnify NPC Pulangi IV HEPP for any loss, damages, or injury on the property of NPC Pulangi IV HEPP due to, arising from the fault, negligence, vandalism, or any unlawful acts of its employees/workers, provided that the loss or damage is made known in writing by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP to the Contractor.

In cases, where NPC Pulangi IV HEPP has provided equipment to the Contractor, the latter shall indemnify NPC for any loss or damages to such



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tools or equipment while the same is in the latter's possession unless the loss or damage is caused by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP.

TS-12.0 WORK AND SAFETY WORKING HOURS

The Contractor shall strictly observe all safety and security rules and regulations while inside the NPC Pulangi IV HEPP premises.

Hauling and clean-up activities inside the NPC Pulangi IV HEPP premises shall be allowed only from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday to Friday. If the Contractors intend to work beyond 5:00 PM and during weekends, authorization must be secured from NPC Pulangi IV HEPP.

The contractor's personnel are not allowed to stay overnight inside the NPC Pulangi IV HEPP Complex unless otherwise a written notice of authorization/permit is issued by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP for a specific date/time.



TS-13.0 MEASUREMENT OF PAYMENT

Payment on completed works shall be allowed subject to usual retention and allowable deductions. Final payment shall be done upon completion of the contract provided that the services provided meet the specifications and are duly accepted by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP.

Measurement of payment will be based on the unit of measure of each pay item satisfactory performed and accepted by NPC Pulangi IV HEPP.
