Corporate Objective for Air Pollution Control

> 100% compliance with all the applicable provisions of the Philippine Clean Air Act (PCAA) and with other Government Policies related to Air Pollution **Control**

Air Pollution Policy for Strict Implementation

NPC Vehicles, All including those assigned to Functional Groups shall undergo Emission Testing and comply with the Emission Standards set by the PCAA. Results of emission tests shall be submitted to the TFMD





Air Pollution Policy for Strict Implementation

Prohibition of "Smoke Belchers" inside the NPC Head Office Compound.





Air Pollution Policy for Strict Implementation

Prohibition of idling of parked vehicles inside the NPC Head Office Compound.



Air Pollution Policy

Prohibition of smoking inside the NPC Head Office Compound, except in the designated "Smoking Area".





Air Pollution Policy for Strict Implementation

Prohibition of open burning inside the NPC Head Office Compound.






Air Pollution Policy



Use of Biofuel for NPC vehicles and emergency power generators to reduce emissions of air pollutants in accordance with DOE directive.





Authorities and Responsibilities

The TFMD, with the assistance of the Environmental Management Department (EMD) and the Corporate Pollution Control Officer (PCO), shall be responsible for the enforcement of air pollution control policies, monitoring implementation and evaluating corporate performance with air pollution control objectives/targets.
